## CRITERIA, COMMITTEE AND TIMELINE

2019 SCHOOL START TIME ADVISORY COMMITTEE

### INTRODUCTION

On June 20, 2019 the Park Hill School District Board of Education authorized the Superintendent and her designees to establish an advisory committee, timeline and evaluation criteria for the implementation of a multi-tiered busing model to begin in the 2020-2021 school year.

### SCHOOL START TIME EVALUATION CRITERIA

The School Start Time Advisory Committee (SSTAC) is charged with reviewing various *School Start Time Plans* that incorporate a multi-tiered busing framework. Plans will be evaluated using a Decision Matrix constructed with the following evaluation criteria.

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### CRITERIA

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#### REDUCTION OF BUS DRIVERS/BUSES/ROUTES

Definition: The *School Start Time Plan* will result in a measurable decrease in the number of bus drivers and buses needed to transport students to and from school. Reduced number of drivers will improve the overall quality of service.

Priority: Critical

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#### ALIGNS WITH FINDINGS FROM SLEEP AND START TIMES RESEARCH COMMITTEE

Definition: The *School Start Time Plan* will align with findings from the district's Sleep and Start Times Research Committee.

Priority: Very Important

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#### COST OF STUDENT TRANSPORTATION

Definition: The *School Start Time Plan* will result in a reduction in costs to transport students daily with annual operating cost savings redirected to the classroom.

Priority: Very Important

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#### MAINTAIN ACCESS TO ACADEMIC/EXTRA CURRICULAR PROGRAMMING

Definition: The School Start Time Plan does not negatively impact current academic opportunities or extracurricular programming.

Priority: Very Important

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#### MAINTAIN SAFETY AT BUS STOPS

Definition: The School Start Time Plan does not negatively impact the safety of students at bus stops.

Priority: Very Important

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#### MINIMIZE NEGATIVE IMPACT ON FAMILIES

Definition: The School Start Time Plan minimizes negative impact on families, such as negative impacts on child care solutions, negative financial impact to families, and negative impact on access to opportunities and activities outside of school.

Priority: Very Important

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#### MINIMIZE CHANGE/DISRUPTION

Definition: The School Start Time Plan minimizes the number of students whose school start time changes by more than 15 minutes.

Priority: Very Important

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#### CONSISTENCY WITH BENCHMARK SCHOOLS/DISTRICTS

Definition: School start and end times within the district's School Start Time Plan is consistent with benchmark school districts.

Priority: Important

Specific metrics, scales and scoring guides will be constructed by district administration.

## 2019-2020 SCHOOL START TIME ADVISORY COMMITTEE

### SELECTION PROCESS

Applications from community members to serve on the committee were received between June 21 and July 3, 2019. Seventeen (17) applications were received. In order to ensure one community member from each attendance area, additional committee members are being recommended.
